Speaker	Rochelle Renninger (Medical & Faith Based Liaison at OneEighty) discussed her role at OneEighty which is a new position.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Her position is focused on alcohol awareness outreach to congregations and the medical community. She has had speaking opportunities with congregations and hospice volunteers in her first few months. Alcohol misuse is the number one reason people come to OneEighty for services. Rochelle discussed the invention of the “Mommy Wine Club” that came about during the pandemic with parents spending more time with children at home. Rochelle does not provide services, but she is able to act as a liaison to people and help refer them to the services they need. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rochelle’s approach to education and outreach is to speak to as many faith-based communities as possible. This approach allows her to address the multitude of views on alcohol use amongst the different denominations individually.

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Chief Birkbeck shared that alcohol is not as big of an issue amongst youth as it used to be, and the biggest issue he is seeing is youth marijuana use. There was a group discussion about changing the acronym for the diversion program, and Chief Birkbeck is open to ideas. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> He also discussed that he is still working on a program like the diversion program. The current working acronym for this program is R.I.D.E.R. (Risk Intervention, Diversion, Education, Restoration) This will be the first program of its kind in Wayne County, and it is getting close to being ready for launch.

RAPA is currently working on what they would like to do at the Pizza & Books event, and a billboard with prevention messaging. RAPA has upcoming presentations at the middle school including an anti-vaping presentation for 7th grade students, and a presentation about clubs available at high school for the 8th grade students. Sharon shared highlights from the CADCA Forum in Washington D.C. that six RAPA students were able to attend. There was a meeting with Senator Sherrod Brown's aide, and one of the RAPA students was able to share a presentation about RAPA during the meeting. The students who went on the trip wrote letters about what they learned, and the consensus was that they learned a lot and enjoyed the trip. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The lollipops will have messaging about Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month in both English and Spanish. RAPA put the presentations together, and two RAPA students are present at each presentation. The forum had a busy schedule for students, and they were able to attend multiple classes about various topics.
