Speaker	Tim Adams – Orrville High School Principal	<ul> <li>Tim began the meeting by stating that he is grateful for the work RAPA has done.</li> <li>Tim shared that students on the video production team made a video about the dangers of drunk driving, and it has had 5,000 views on YouTube.</li> <li>The main reason Tim came to the meeting was to discuss how to do intervention with students using substances.</li> <li>The school currently approaches student substance use on a case-by-case basis, and the responses include suspension, calling parents, and confiscation of substances and paraphernalia.</li> <li>He would like to see more peer-to-peer partnerships where older students are role models for younger students.</li> <li>Tim asked if there are any intervention programs that are currently being used, and OneEighty staff discussed intervention being the biggest gap in service they are seeing from an agency perspective.</li> <li>Hannah shared that Catholic Charities is seeing similar issues that OneEighty is seeing with intervention programming including finding evidence-based programming, funding, and staff capacity to implement the programming.</li> <li>Tim asked if the coalition could partner with the video production team by supporting them financially and working with them on content. Another item he requested is to keep sponsoring the t-shirts being thrown at athletic events because they are having an impact.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Vaping and alcohol are the biggest issues he is seeing in the school.</li> <li>There was a lengthy group discussion on intervention options, and community resources that currently exist to address these concerns.</li> <li>Some of the programs that were discussed included D.A.R.E., Al-Anon, and Alateen.</li> <li>Anazao does intervention programming, but they are not able to come into the schools which leads to an additional challenge of transporting students in need to receive services.</li> <li>Potential solutions for now include partnering with Boys and Girls Club, and utilizing the youth diversion program Chief Birkbeck is working on when it launches.</li> </ul>

	Community Town Hall Recap	<ul> <li>There were no attendees at the Community Town Hall event, but staff now has Parents Who Host informational materials for future coalition events.</li> </ul>	
RAPA	Sharon and Valeria	<ul> <li>Valeria asked for an update on the billboard that RAPA designed. The billboard will be put up on Back Orrville and Smucker roads.</li> <li>Sharon reported that RAPA will be doing their final presentations to the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students on May 15<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>Sharon reported that the coalition will be assisting RAPA initiatives for next year by purchasing throw shirts for girls soccer games, and purchasing orientation folders for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students.</li> <li>Valeria said she would like to open up RAPA to include middle school students and believes there would be enough interest in middle school to expand RAPA.</li> <li>RAPA will be going to Putt-n-Stuff for an end of the year celebration, and the date is yet to be determined.</li> <li>Sharon reported that the OHS carnival went well, and \$400 was raised for Akron Children's.</li> <li>Sharon and RAPA will have a table at the Orrville Library Summer Reading Program Kickoff Event on June 3<sup>rd</sup>.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Staff is working with Utt Brothers Marketing on getting the billboard put up.</li> <li>Sharon discussed revamping the presentations next year, specifically the 8<sup>th</sup> grade presentation, to include additional topics such as bullying.</li> </ul>
