Other Business	Youth Intervention Program (YIP) DARE Training Sign Coalition Involvement Agreements	 There was a group discussion about vaping and the harm it poses to youth which led to an update on the Youth Intervention Program (YIP) from Chief Birkbeck. Chief Birkbeck started by summarizing YIP for Dan Steidl and explained that the program is seeking to have a tailored intervention for small offenses so less children go through juvenile court. Lisa asked Chief Birkbeck if any officers needed DARE training, and he said he has one officer he would like to send for training. Chief Birkbeck said there is no possibility of officers receiving DARE training over the summer due to other training requirements, and that the soonest an officer could be trained is this coming fall. Chief Birkbeck currently has one officer trained in DARE already, but his training was in middle school curriculum. Chief Birkbeck also reported that every school will have an SRO next year. Chief Birkbeck signed his Coalition Involvement Agreement. 	 Catholic Charities and Wayne County Courts have been instrumental in developing this program, and Chief Birkbeck is currently looking for opportunities and community partners who are available to expand the scope of this program. Chief Birkbeck said OPD will have training funds available to send officers for DARE training, but the issue is finding the time for them to go. Lisa will follow-up with Chief Birkbeck about whether that officer can provide DARE training at the elementary school as well as the middle school.
